266 OPEN FORUM:

- 1. The lines in Higher Town have not yet been replaced and the parking situation is already problematic. Cllr Gilbert will speak with Highways about the lines and final surfacing works being completed by Easter.
- 2. A query regarding co-option was raised. To date co-options have been dealt with through the receipt of an expression of interest followed by a paper ballot with only the name of successful candidates being made public. A written policy is being considered for adoption. There is no statutory procedure for how councils undertake their co-options.
- 3. NT Ranger, Emma Reece advised that there has been hardy shrub planting at East Soar Farm, this is in the last field towards Overbecks house, the project will be finished in next fortnight. They have been working with the tenant to obtain certain grants, some stock fencing will be replaced with new hedge banks. Part of the work will include the installation of a multi user path parallel to the main farm track to enable people to walk down separately from the traffic. In the long term the aim is to create a path that stretches to the rear of Overbecks. There will also be stone wall repair and other investment in infrastructure. Councillors were offered a site visit, other visits for the general public will be organised. A Councillor advised that broken gate at Lower Soar was fixed but it requires more attention before peak season to ensure livestock doesn't escape as it is not unusual for walkers to leave it unlatched.

1. South Hams Composting Pilots: With the support of South Hams District Council, Sustainable South Hams is conducting a series of compost pilots in the region. The pilots are starting at a small scale in a few locations, but if successful, will be rolled out more widely. Composting provides a valuable and easy way to reduce carbon emissions, increase soil fertility and encourage community engagement in climate and nature action.

The objectives of the pilot programme are

- To increase the knowledge and support for community composting schemes.
- To put redundant brown bins to good use
- To inspire and inform residents about home composting
- To explore ways to offer street level composting of food waste

This offer is also being made to Sustainability Groups across the South Hams so interested parties should liaise with your local group to avoid duplication.

- Full council have approved the plan for the coming year, this includes an increase in council tax of 2.99%. They also approved imposing a premium (up to 200% council tax) for second homes, this will be imposed from 1st April 2025. Changes will also be made to unoccupied properties both furnished and unfurnished. It is the intention of DC that all of the premium raised from this will be spent on affordable and social housing.
- 3. On 22nd February there was a council tax setting meeting to agree the final tax levels for 2024/25, bills are now being issued.
- 4. Town & Parish training took place in January, this was a well-attended, three-hour session, with good feedback. Further training sessions will be organised.
- 5. South Devon & Dartmoor Community Partnership is an organisation of agencies working together (including Police, Fire, local authorities, probation service etc.), they were contacted in June 2023 regarding issues in Malborough, this has been raised again and a contact has been provided to the clerk to share details of problems in the parish.
- 6. The Councils Overview & Scrutiny Committee met recently, this meeting saw the General Manager of Fusion Leisure attending to answer questions on some of the issues regarding cleanliness/maintenance. They have not met a number of standards and have a programme over the coming year to increase cleanliness/maintenance levels and to increase employment levels to bring the four centres back to standard. South Hams District Council will be meeting with them every six months.
- Ward Councillors have both a Sustainable Localities Fund and a Climate Change and Biodiversity Fund -£2,000 each per fund. Full details are available on the District Council website.
- 8. The front office of the police station has now open to the public in Kingsbridge.
- 9. South Devon National Landscape has received a £2,246,965 grant from The National Lottery Heritage Fund for an exciting project 'Life on the Edge' focussed along the South Devon coast. Made possible by money raised by National Lottery players, the multi partner project will deliver a programme to help restore thriving populations of some of the UK's rarest insects living along the coast between Berry Head in Torbay and Wembury near Plymouth.

273 BUSINESS TO BE NOTED/DISCUSSED:

- a) To approve works required to the park (Village Hall Playing Fields). It was **RESOLVED** to approve the works and request SHDC to undertake the urgent issues.
- b) Vehicle Activated Signage. One VAS machine has been damaged during a recent storm and the plastic casing broken. A second unit is currently on a post that has started to lean due to the amount of rain/wind experienced in recent weeks. This will be referred to Cllr Sampson.
- c) To consider an event for the 80th anniversary of D Day (6th June). Deferred to March.
- d) It was **RESOLVED** to renew Messenger Advertising at the same rates as last year.
 A request had been received for regular articles from the local Anthony Mangnall MP, by unanimous agreement this was not approved.

- e) It was **RESOLVED** to approve the installation of safety lighting at Withymore for the Snow Wardens. It was further **RESOLVED** to accept the quotation from JKR Electrical Services for £877.76 (including VAT) to install security lighting at Withymore Farm in connection with the use of the gritter. It was noted that we do not pay any funds for storage of the gritter/salt, nor do we pay for utilities such as water used for cleaning the equipment after use.
- f) Youth Group. It was **RESOLVED** to provide funds of £500 towards initial costs including the fees for DBS checks.
- g) It was **RESOLVED** to support and have involvement with the Salcombe Community Economic Plan.
- h) Project updates: Cllr Perkins provided an updated overview of the proposed car park. It was **RESOLVED** to wait for the Fields In Trust response at which time an additional meeting regarding the car park can be scheduled to approve the tender documents to be issued.
 MUGA: A revised financial update has been provided including a fence with noise reduction.
 BOULES: An estimate has been provided on current costs for the proposed boules court.

These two areas would be classed as phase 1 and would cost between £29,000 and £35,000. The finances would be covered via grant applications. It was **RESOLVED** to support the submission of grant applications for phase 1.

Updated estimates have been received for the proposed pump track, gym and skate park, these three areas will be covered in phase 2. Further information will be provided at the March/April meetings.
